1. CALL TO ORDER

Councillor Karsten, Chair called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m. in Council Chamber, 3rd Floor City Hall, 1841 Argyle Street, Halifax.

2. APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES - NONE

3. Fiscal Direction

The following was before Council:

• A staff recommendation report dated December 5, 2017

Jerry Blackwood, Acting Chief Financial Officer provided introductory remarks with respect to the Fiscal Direction presentation.

Louis De Montbrun, Manager of Financial Reporting provided a presentation with respect to the draft 2018-19 Capital Plan.

Bruce Fisher, Manager of Financial Policy and Planning provided a presentation with respect to the Multi-Year Budgeting process.

Councillor Karsten called three times for members of the public to address Regional Council on the Fiscal Direction presentation. There were no members of the public.

MOVED by Councillor Walker, seconded by Councillor Whitman

THAT Budget Committee recommend that Halifax Regional Council recommended that staff revise the 2018-2019 Budget according to Council's approved priorities, and preliminary fiscal direction, including:

- Maintaining the appropriate level of existing services with the addition of the new services previously approved by Council;
- A stable capital budget that maintains state of good repair while also funding growth related issues and service improvements;
- A responsible and declining debt position;
- Appropriate reserve balances that allow for risk mitigation, future obligations and opportunities;
- Alignment of the current average tax bill for residential homes and commercial properties at a 1.9% increase, and that

Regional Council approve the "Advanced Tender Project List" in Appendix A of the Budget Committee report dated December 5, 2027.

In response to concerns raised by Regional Council, Louis De Montbrun and Bruce Fisher provided clarification on the following:

- A summary of the street recapitalization projects outlined in Appendix B of the December 5, 2017 staff report.
- The impacts of the Halifax Regional Police and Halifax Regional Fire and Emergency Services Collective Agreements on the 2018/19 budget.
- Opportunities for partnerships with other levels of government to fund future capital projects.
- Current trends with respect to declining assessments for commercial properties.
- The inclusion of Integrated Mobility Plan projects, not already accounted for within future budget reporting.

- Strategic planning for future capital projects not currently approved by Council to redefine priorities.
- Potential reserve funding gaps if the sale of surplus municipal properties is not realized.

In response to a follow up questions, Jerry Blackwood, Acting Chief Financial Office advised that staff will bring forward a long-term capital plan after deliberations of the 2018-19 budget are complete.
