The meeting was called to order at 12:30 p.m. and moved In Camera (In Private) at 1:00 p.m. The meeting reconvened in public session at 2:10 and adjourned at 2:44 p.m.

The Chair called the meeting to order at 12:30 p.m., at Halifax Hall, City Hall, 1841 Argyle St., Halifax and acknowledged that the meeting took place in the ancestral unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people.

10.1.1 HRM Wortley Report Recommendations – Update

- Community Engagement
- Data Collection
- Street Check Ban

Dan Kinsella, Chief of the Halifax Regional Police Department, provided an update on HRP's progress with the HRM Wortley Report recommendations including information relating to community engagement, data collection, and the street check ban. It was noted that HRP continues to do outreach with the community to ensure individuals are aware of the mechanism to approach the department for complaints. Chief Kinsella noted that two (2) Freedom of Information Requests have been submitted to date and that they are being processed according to policy. It was also noted that the ban on streetchecks continues.

There was some discussion surrounding the recruitment process for the Chief's Advisory Committee. Chief Kinsella noted that the Committee is still in its early phases and that HRP is currently consulting with the community.

Janis Gray, Chief Superintendent of the Halifax Detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, provided an update on the Halifax District RCMP's progress with the HRM Wortley Report recommendations including information relating to community engagement, data collection, and the street check ban. Chief Superintendent Gray noted the following:

- Community Mobilization Teams have started holding meetings
- The RCMP is working with HRP to ensure adherence to federal law as it relates to data collection and the use of any data that was collected previously
- The Department of Justice (DOJ) has created a road map to establish a communication link with the public for the Know Your Rights campaign

10.1.2 Wortley Recommendations Summary Review

Commissioner Borden provided a brief review of the Wortley recommendations that have been completed to date as well as those that are ongoing. It was also noted that the majority of these recommendations will be ongoing.

10.1.3 Overview of and Update on the Foundation

The following was before the Board of Police Commissioners:

• A presentation entitled "Halifax Regional Police Foundation"

Chief Kinsella provided a short presentation on the Halifax Regional Police Foundation.

The Board discussed the presentation with Chief Kinsella responding to questions. Specifically, there was some discussion on "justice reinvestment" and how HRP uses proceeds from crime (i.e., funding acquired from summary offence tickets). Chief Kinsella informed the Board that they would follow-up on this question at the next meeting.

 - b. Add a review of the Board of Police Commissioners' Extra-Duty and Off-Duty Policy when relevant HRP policies are amended; and,
- 2. Accept the April 30, 2020 deadline for survey completion under the Board Self-Evaluation Policy.

10.1.5 Community Survey – Update

Commissioner Borden noted that the Request for Procurement (RFP) with the vendor that was originally hired to establish the community survey has expired, which will inevitably delay the survey's completion. Commissioner Borden also requested that the Board begin thinking about important questions that should be included in the survey from the community's perspective.

10.1.6 RCMP 2021/2022 Budget

Commissioner Borden noted that the process for the RCMP budget is separate from HRP's budget and the deadline for any changes is December 1, 2020. It was also noted that a meeting with DOJ has been scheduled for March 13, 2020 to discuss potential changes to the 2020/2021 RCMP Halifax District budget.

Chief Superintendent Gray noted that a meeting was held with the RCMP, HRP, and DOJ to discuss the various Wortley recommendations. It was also noted that the three parties went through each recommendation to ensure an understanding of ownership and deliverables.

10.4 HRP/RCMP CHIEF UPDATES

Chief Kinsella provided the HRP update. The following points were noted:

- The Police Foundation held their second meeting in February 2020
- The Police Foundation is looking for two (2) new members
- On February 28, 2020, officers apprehended an individual driving under the influence who had injured several residents in Bedford
- Community outreach continues internally and externally there have been four town halls and/or information sessions

Chief Superintendent Gray provided the RCMP update. The following points were noted:

- According to the annual update on the Crime Reduction Initiative (i.e., motivation to lock and secure properties at night), there has been an eighteen (18) percent reduction across the Halifax District
- On February 27, 2020, warrants were executed around six (6) locations within HRM and eight (8) individuals were arrested for cocaine-related offences and this was linked to a local motorcycle gang
- An opioid more potent than fentanyl has been discovered in HRM
