This policy will limit but not prohibit the ability of police to make public statements about matters that: (1) are currently the subject of a police complaint investigation, or (2) for which it is reasonably foreseeable that a complaint will be filed in the near

future.

Martin Ward, Solicitor advised the Board of Police Commissioners of the Commission's mandate to create a communications policy for Halifax Regional Police and the appropriate procedure to follow to prepare and approve a policy.
