



Q: When do paving/road construction projects typically start? When do they end?

A: Paving, road and sidewalk work normally runs between May and October.

Q: What are regular working hours?

A: This depends on the road being worked on, but most road work runs from 7 a.m. until 6 p.m. Peak hours restrictions - 7-9 a.m., and 4-6 p.m. - means work can't impede traffic flow on main arteries during the busiest times.

Q: Why isn't road work/construction done at night?

A: The municipality does occasionally work on projects at night, but this is a challenge, given the proximity to residential neighbourhoods, safety, and the fact that any noise travels that much further when the surrounding noise level is lower. It's something we continue to look at, but again, the challenge is doing so without impacting upon the surrounding residential area.

Q: Who, other than HRM, could be doing road work at any given time?

A: Road work or paving projects could be done by HRM, a private contractor, the Province of Nova Scotia, the Halifax-Dartmouth Bridge Commission, Halifax Water, a land developer, or one of the Utilities (including Heritage Gas).
