
A marked crosswalk is on the Capital Project list for installation in 2018 at the Sackville Drive, Beaconsfield Way and Executive Drive intersection. The new

UPDATE ON PETITION – LUCASVILLE ROAD | SACKVILLE DRIVE CROSSWALK REQUEST

HRM Traffic Analysts and Engineers have met to discuss the request by area residents for a crosswalk at Lucasville Road and Sackville Drive to facilitate safety for students walking to and from Sackville Heights Elementary School.

A study was done earlier in the spring to obtain pedestrian data; at that time the counts did not warrant a crosswalk. Another count is planned for this fall. Staff will also gather speed data for this location. A further update will be provided once the results of the data collection are available.


Halifax Water will be hosting an **OPEN HOUSE** from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. on **Wednesday**, **November**


