FREE yourself of clutter and find some great FREE items of your own! Put out your unwanted household items during <u>Curbside Give Away</u> Weekend instead of discarding them. It's a fantastic way to reduce the amount of garbage ending up in the landfill. This event happens rain or shine.

Curbside Give Away etiquette for placing items at the curb:

- place signs on items with the word "FREE"
- items should still be in good condition for re-use or able to be repaired
- keep items you do not want to give away close to your house, or inside to avoid confusion
- don't discard items on another person's lawn

Halifax Regional Municipality has developed an interactive map, powered by Esri technology, (the "Application") to encourage and enhance participation in the event. This Application allows you to post descriptions and photos of free items you have placed by the curb. Once an item is taken, you should delete your post so that others don't come looking for the item.



Collection will occur as usual on Tuesday, May 29th (green cart/recyclables). The next collection for the area as noted will be Thursday, June 7th (garbage/recyclables).
