- Regional Council's March 21, 2017 motion feasibility of a 50-metre competition pool



Current State

- Estimated population 431,000
- Demographics & residential growth
- Total inventory
- Service delivery model



Purpose

 To recommend strategic directions for the provision of aquatic facilities over the next 15 years





Approach

- Similar to the Long-Term Arena Strategy (2012).
- Extensive community and stakeholder engagement
 - Stakeholder working group
 - Outreach engagement
 - Public survey
 - Facility managers
 - Evidence-based analysis
