CASE 22334 PUBLIC INFORMATION MEETING AUGUST 15th



Planning staff have received an application by WM Fares – <u>Case 22334</u>- requesting to enter into a development agreement to allow for a one-storey commercial building with four leaseholds and 41 parking spaces in the rear of the property at 1401 Sackville Drive, Middle Sackville.

Existing zoning does not permit stand-alone commercial uses on the property, however; Policy UR-20 of the Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS) does enable the request to enter into a Development Agreement to permit commercial service uses on the property.

ROSLEY ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT – UPDATE



On October 18, 2018, a Request for Proposal (RFP#18-324) was issued for Engineering Services for the replacement design of Rosley Road Bridge (BR065), Beaver Bank. The tender closed on November 8, 2018: Hatch Corporation was awarded the tender on December 3, 2018.

The project was planned as part of the 2019 road construction season; however, it will not be able to be completed by the September 2019 deadline. That is the date when all work within the waterway area is required to be completed by the provincial environmental guidelines. HRM staff requested an extension to enable completion of the project this year. The



provincial departments of Fisheries & Oceans and Environment suggested the construction be moved to next year so

as not to impact fish habitat. Staff plan to complete the tender this year and start construction in early 2020.

HALIFAX WATER LUCASVILLE ROAD WATERMAIN TWINNING PROJECT

Atlantic Road Construction and Paving (ARCP), has been installing 3.7 km of water transmission main along Lucasville Road on behalf of Halifax Water. The work zone is from approximately 1400 Lucasville Road to Bryanston Road.

It is important to note that businesses within the work zone remain open.



The project is expected to continue into October. A second crew of pipe fitters has been hired to ensure the project stays on schedule.

HRM will partner to complete full-width asphalt between 1400 Lucasville Road and Waterstone Run (approximately 2 km). For the remainder of the project limits, between Waterstone Run and Bryanstone Road, the full northwest lane (half of the road width) will be paved.





FENERTY ROAD & SPRINGFIELD LAKE ROAD TRAFFIC CALMING

Thank you to residents who have called in to report missing street signs at the intersection of Fenerty Road and Springfield Lake Road and requests for traffic calming. Good news! Staff will be replacing the street name blades missing at the intersection of Fenerty Road and Springfield Lake Road.

In regard to traffic calming, Springfield Lake Road from Sackville Drive to Fenerty Road is privately owned (even though HRM does provide winter maintenance), therefore; it is ineligible for traffic calming because it is not an HRM-owned street and, it is a gravel road which also makes it ineligible.



Fenerty Drive is currently in the process of data collection for traffic calming.
Springfield Lake Drive from Fenerty Road to end has been sent to our Road

Safety Engineer for evaluation.

Our Traffic Analyst has advised that a stop sign on Fenerty Road will not be installed as we do not typically install stop signs on 2 out of 3 legs of an intersection as this could be confusing to drivers. All-way stops are warranted at locations where there are significant and relatively equal volumes of traffic on each leg.





WATER METERS / SERVICE IN LAND LEASE COMMUNITIES – UPDATE

Councillors Lorelei Nicoll, Richard Zurawski and I have met with Dalhousie Legal Aid their representatives who have worked with residents to prepare a response to the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (NSUARB) and search by M09227 regarding water service and water meters in land lease communities. I am pleased to advise that we have submitted a response to the NSUARB regarding what we believe to be unreasonable demands on tenants in the land lease communities regarding water service. Our deadline for response was extended, at our request, to July 31st. The information is available on the NSUARB's website.

the Bonnie Ryan Sports Court.

Ms. Ryan volunteered on numerous boards and committees and spearheaded several local recreation and community initiatives being awarded multiple certificates and awards of appreciation for her tireless efforts on behalf of her community. Despite the struggles associated with her ongoing cancer battle, she spent several months forging ahead to ensure the multi-purpose sports pad at Harold T Barrett Junior High School in Beaver Bank became a reality. She applied for grants, pursued politicians and fund-raised. This is just one of her many projects which began in 2005 and the pad opened on October 5, 2013.

Ms. Ryan was tiny in stature but mighty in force as she gave 100% of her energy to ensuring her community received the best services possible.

HRM's Asset Naming Policy <u>Administrative</u> Order 46 (AO46) allows any person or group to apply for a commemorative name for HRM assets, particularly streets, parks or buildings. AO46 requires the Civic Addressing Coordinator to consult with at least one representative from each asset category, the municipal archivist, and a representative from HRM Cultural Affairs on each application. The Committee also consults with the local Councillor(s) for each application.
