SURPLUS PROPERTY ON **MARGESSON DRIVE**

Good news! By a July 30th motion of Regional Council, the surplus property on Margesson Drive has been converted to the Community Interest stream under Administrative Order 50 Respecting the Disposal of Surplus Real Property.

Community Interest

- (b) Properties known to have potential for community use, in particular where:
 - there has been a prior community or institutional use of the property; or
- by location or scarcity of available property the consideration would reasonably arise.

This brings the Cobequid Cultural Society (CCS) one step closer to fulfilling their goal of a new Arts Centre that will include a community radio station, art gallery and learning opportunities such as dance studios. Much of the future space already has tenants interested although the building has not yet been built!

The second recommendation of the July 30th motion by Regional Council was: Subject to the outcome of the Secondary Planning Process and the approvals required to facilitate the development proposal on this site inclusive of addressing land use, subdivision, shared parking, vehicle access and egress, proximity to Provincial right of ways, as well as the size and location of septic fields; and subject to the parties reaching a viable shared parking arrangement; return to Council with the recommended steps and terms of the property conveyance for final approval by Council.

The report responding to the above is expected at Regional Council by November 2021.

NO FLYERS – FREE STICKERS NOW AVAILABLE



NO FLYERS BY-LAW: F-400

HALIFAX

On June 4th Regional Council approved <u>By-law</u> <u>F-400, Respecting the Distribution of Flyers</u>. The stickers / decals are now available at HRM <u>Customer Service Centers</u>, libraries and recreation centers or you can <u>print your own!</u>

The cost of printing 'NO FLYERS' signs is \$0.28 (adhesive) and \$0.36 (removable) per sign, with an initial print of 10,000. These costs will be covered by existing Solid Waste Resources communication and education budgets.

The closest location for District 14 residents to obtain the stickers / decals is the Acadia Centre at 636 Sackville Drive, open Monday to Friday from 8:30 am – 4:30 pm (closed statutory holidays).

EGG-LAYING HENS / CHICKENS

For those residents hoping to have back-yard chickens / laying hens, you will be pleased to learn that on July 30th, Regional Council passed the following motion on <u>Case 22227</u>:

That Halifax Regional Council direct the Chief Administrative Officer to:

- 1. Initiate a process to consider amendments to the Regional Municipal Planning Strategy and all applicable Secondary Municipal Planning Strategies and Land Use By-laws as necessary to permit the keeping and raising of all egglaying fowl consistent with the proposed policy direction outlined within the Discussion section of the staff report dated June 12, 2019; and
- 2. Follow the public participation program as set out in the Community Engagement section of the staff report dated June 12, 2019.



The report is expected to be at Regional Council by February 2021.

LUCASVILLE ROAD – HALIFAX WATER WATERMAIN TWINNING PROJECT

Many thanks to Debra Lucas of the Lucasville Community Association for being the community's liaison with Halifax Water regarding the watermain twinning project. Debra is certainly keeping their feet to the fire in addressing community concerns as quickly as they arise.



Since the beginning of the project, Debra and I have encouraged Halifax Water to communicate with the residents to keep everyone updated on the progress. Halifax Water has obliged by holding a few community meetings to update residents on the project and has sent out notifications such as this <u>recent one</u> dated August 9, 2019.

The current issue is concern with school bus service along this route when school begins on

September 5th. Debra has Halifax Water and their contractor, ACRP, talking with Stock Transportation regarding the Lucasville Road construction and school bus service.

Halifax Water advises that all efforts are being made to keep the work areas as short as possible to reduce traffic wait times. On weekends between Friday evening and Monday morning the traffic control setup is monitored 24-hours a day.

Halifax Water has also explained that when the new water main is connected to the existing water main, up to 3 road closures will be needed as the excavation will cross Lucasville Road. Local and emergency access will be maintained to each property; however, access will be from one end of Lucasville Road or the other. There will be no passage through the work site. Lucasville Road will be "Local Traffic Only" during these times. It is estimated the work will occur on weekends this fall. Specific notification will be delivered to all homes in advance of these closures. Some closures will coincide with a water service disruption for some residents. Specific notification will be distributed in advance.

Thank you Debra, and all residents of Lucasville, for your understanding and assistance during this project.


