

- Solid Waste Business Unit
 - 5 Waste Educators
 - 2 Diversion Compliance Officers
- Waste Education
 - 4000 hours per year of waste education at schools, businesses, and events

- Diversion Compliance Officers
 - o Enforce By Laws: S-600, L-200, F-400
 - Approximately 1200 visits annually
 - Approximately 400 Notices to Comply issued annually


Curbside Monitoring Program

- Initiated with the implementation of clear bags in 2015
- Monitoring participation rates in ~ 300 homes in 8 electoral districts per year
- Established a means to measure progress, success and areas for improvement
 - Different styles of messages
 - Enforcement / compliance



Clear Bags in Condominiums

- 182 condominium buildings participate in municipal collection program
- 32 condominium buildings have participated in clear bag pilot
- Key Findings:
 - Chutes are problematic
 - Comingling /contamination is an issue
 - Enforcing clear bags will improve diversion





Next Steps

- Solid waste program is a system
 - ✓ Changes to system best evaluated through holistic review
- Last system review was in 2014
- Need clarity on outcome of Organics RFP and EPR
- Possibility of system review in FY 2021/2022?
