CBC Music and CARAS have many overlapping objectives which makes the CBC an integral part of what CARAS accomplishes throughout the year.

Their commitment to amplifying an array of diverse voices of Canadian music 365 days a year across all genres make this partnership strong and serendipitous. No media outlet tells the story of Canadian artists and their impact on our culture better than the CBC.

CBC contributes to telling our artists stories through a wide range of JUNOS 365 programming including; Music Day on CBC, which is 4-hours of national televised content, CBC Music Showcases throughout JUNO Week featuring Classical, Jazz, Indigenous, Rap/R&B and more.





Working in partnership



Coming together on priority initiatives

CARAS is committed and looking forward to working closely with the City of Halifax to align with their goals and objectives to engage and elevate Halifax's diverse music scene leading up to and including JUNO Week.

Once officially partnered, CARAS will work closely with the Host Committee and the City of Halifax to ensure we achieve the city and province's objectives as to why they want to host The JUNO Awards.

Below are some examples of what we can work on together:

- Professional development: Aligning with CARAS' and MusiCounts mandate we will work closely with the city to amplify opportunities for training and learning.
- Support of grassroots music events: CARAS can support the city's efforts by including these events within our JUNOfest and other event opportunities.
- An amplification of Nova Scotian voices: CARAS can help shine a light on local artists and bands by including them in our programming.


MusiCounts Band Aid Program

- In 2022, donated \$875,000 to schools in need across Canada to support music education
 - 6 recipients were located in the Nova Scotia (78 total across Canada)



MusiCounts TD Community Music Program

In 2022, donated \$500,000 to community music programs in need.

Developing an equitable and inclusive music community

Career Development

CARAS and MusiCounts have multiple initiatives and programs that focus on the next generation of music industry professionals and partners with organizations such as: CMI, CIMA, ADVANCE, Music Canada, Music Publishers Canada, Honey Jam, Hxouse, and more, to bring opportunities to life.

- The Allan Slaight JUNO Master Class mentors 4 artists that undergo a 2 part 1-week mentorship on all facets of the music industry. The program is built in partnership with CMI.
- Rising is currently a 8-part content series, in partnership with Ontario Creates, that tells the story behind the music of an emerging artist and the life experiences that brought them to where they are.
- MusiCounts Tracks is a online resource that hosts a wide variety of short introduction videos
 of all aspects of the music industry (publishing, rights/licensing, producing, entertainment
 lawyer, etc.)
- The MusiCounts Accelerate Scholarship helps accelerate the careers of aspiring music professionals. This scholarship includes a financial award and a unique mentorship experience



Developing an equitable and inclusive music community

Career Development (con't)

■ The MusiCounts Amplify Scholarship help amplify the aspirations of high school-aged students with an interest in pursuing a career path in music. This scholarship includes a financial award, a mentorship and a peer-to-peer networking experience.

DEI Initiatives

- CARAS and MusiCounts has been and continues to be committed to dismantling systemic racism and being a part of changes that positively affect the makeup of the music community. CARAS is committed to the long-term inclusion and amplification of BIPOC voices and a more equitable industry.
- CARAS and MusiCounts has signed the Declaration to end Anti-Black Racism in the Canadian Music Industry presented by CIMA and ADVANCE through their Breakdown Down Racial Barriers program they initiated in 2020.
- We have and continue to undertake internal reviews of processes (public and internal) to become a more equitable and inclusive organization. We are engaging Feminuity to further this work.
- We apply a lens of diversity to all of our programming

The JUNOS has evolved from an industry awards evening to a weeklong festival and our evolution does not stop there. We celebrate Canadian music achievements at all levels year-round.
