MIXED USE ZONING SURVEY

On May 17th, Regional Council passed a motion to consider changing the size thresholds for permitted commercial uses, encouraging children's recreation and other low impact commercial uses, while mitigating the higher impact commercial uses for the Mixed Use 1 Zone. Staff are seeking feedback from the communities including and surrounding Beaver Bank, Hammonds Plains, and Upper Sackville to hear your thoughts on the appropriate size of different commercial uses in the MU-1 Zone. REGIONAL PLAN UPDATE



HRM's Regional Plan sets out a common vision, principles and long-range, region-wide planning policies outlining where, when, and how future growth and development should take place between now and 2031. We are now in Phase 3 of 5 of the Regional Plan. Certain adjustments can still be made to the plan as it currently stands, and we are still collecting feedback from residents.

An in-person public hearing to hear feedback about the proposed amendments for Phase 3 will be held at the September 27th Regional Council Meeting, at 6:00 p.m. in Council Chambers (City Hall).

NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION: SEPTEMBER 30TH



September 30th is now a federal statutory holiday called the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. Formerly known as Orange Shirt Day, this day provides an opportunity to recognize and commemorate the ongoing legacy of residential schools, ensuring that this tragic part of Canada's history - that continues to have lasting impacts - is never forgotten.

Additionally, every year on October 1st, Nova Scotians mark Treaty Day to celebrate the rich history, proud culture, and important contributions of Mi'kmaq people. These centuries-old treaties honour the enduring bond of friendship and respect between Nova Scotia's Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities and reaffirm the historic presence

of the Mi'kmaw who have occupied the land for thousands of years.

I encourage you to wear an orange shirt on September 30th and attend these commemorative events, as I plan to do:

- Ceremony for National Truth & Reconciliation Day on Grand Parade Square: September 30th at 6:00 p.m.
- Flag raising for Treaty Day at Grand Parade: October 3rd, 2022, at 11:30 a.m.

While Treaty Day is officially October 1st, this year's flag raising will be taking place on in Grand Parade Square on October 3rd.

Former residential school students can call 1-866-925-4419 for emotional crisis referral services and information on other health supports from the Government of Canada.



SENIORS CARE GRANT APPLICATIONS OPEN



The Provincial government has opened applications for the Seniors Care Grant! The Seniors Care Grant provides up to \$500 to help eligible seniors with the costs of household and healthcare services. Seniors applying for the Seniors Care Grant are also able to apply for a one-time Home Heating grant of \$250 to help with heating costs.

To qualify for the grant, you need to be 65 or older by March 31st, 2023 and meet all the following criteria:

- 1. have a household net income of \$37,500 or less,
- 2. live in your own home or apartment,
- 3. your name is on the property title, Land Titles Initiative Certificate of Claim or residential lease agreement, and
- have paid (or will pay) for household and healthcare services and home heating between June 1st, 2022 and March 31st, 2023.

Land Acknowledgement

The Halifax Regional Municipality is located in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and traditional lands of the Mi'kmaq people. The municipality acknowledges the Peace and Friendship Treaties signed in this Territory and recognizes that we are all Treaty People.

Halifax is committed to strengthening its relationship with Indigenous communities and honouring the significant contributions of Indigenous peoples. Another way the municipality has demonstrated this is by formalizing the official Land Acknowledgement: "The Halifax Regional Municipality is located in Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and traditional lands of the Mi'kmaq people. The municipality acknowledges the Peace and Friendship Treaties signed in this Territory and recognizes that we are all Treaty People."

Historically, a Land Acknowledgment is a traditional practice shared amongst Indigenous groups to recognize the Indigenous land and territory they are visiting. Now, making a respectful Land Acknowledgement remains a way to express gratitude and respect to

Indigenous peoples for being stewards of the land we live and work on. It is an important step in reconciliation.

A land acknowledgment is an important statement that acknowledges we understand the long-standing history that has brought us to reside on this land and that we seek to understand our place with that history. In Nova Scotia, we are all Treaty People; with that comes roles and responsibilities.
