ICE THICKNESS TESTING



Did you know that the municipality provides weekly reports on ice thickness testing on more than 70 lakes throughout the Halifax region? Ice thickness testing has begun for the season, and results will be posted on halifax.ca/icetesting as they become available.

The Canadian Red Cross recommends that ice be at least 15 centimeters thick for individual skating, and at least 20 centimeters thick for group skating. Extreme caution is advised in areas where streams flow into and out of lakes. It is also important to note that ice conditions may vary over the entire surface of lakes and are subject to change with weather conditions.

With many thanks to HRM staff, the busy crosswalk on Washmill Lake Drive at Grandhaven Boulevard has received new RA-5 signage with overhead flashing lights to improve safety. At the February 7th meeting of Regional Council, Council approved the sale of Park West School Park to the Province of Nova Scotia for a new school. The Province indicated that a new school is required in Clayton Park West. They reviewed 9 different locations and requested these four parkland parcels as they are directly adjacent to the current P-9 Park West School. I know many of you expressed concerns about selling this land, though please be aware that all money from this sale will be allocated to future greenspace. HRM staff have reviewed the area and provided the opinion that the surrounding community contains many parks that include a variety of recreation amenities and natural areas. Population growth has exceeded projections since 2019, the proposed school will be 125,000 square feet and would accommodate approximately 800-1,000 students.
