

Morning,

The August 24 meeting would work for me. What I will be making the case for/asking for (I think) is for the committee to determine (via report/stakeholder engagement) the safest way for non car users to use shared road space, and then use that information to change road safety messaging. For example, previous heads-up campaigns said things like "make eye contact" and "check mirrors." Not to say that either of those are bad, but it would also be good if the city had messaging directed at drivers like "Cyclists move to the front at traffic lights" or "Cyclists can take the lane for their safety." This is first draft stuff, but essentially I think council should direct staff to make sure all future messaging puts an appropriately large share of the shared responsibility on the driver, as it should be, and include messaging that normalizes safe active transit behaviour and starts to adjust driver expectations.
