



MetroX Commuter Transit Service to Tantallon

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ'S)

What kind of transit service is MetroX?

Linking suburban communities to the downtown core, MetroX is a limited-stop, direct transit service, designed specifically with the commuter in mind.

Where and when will the MetroX service begin?

The Tantallon service begins on Monday, August 31, 2009.

From where does the MetroX bus leave?

MetroX leaves from the Hubley Centre in Tantallon, travels the 103 highway into downtown Halifax, stopping on Abermarle Street (formerly Market Street), with easy access to Scotia Square.

Is there a Park & Ride available?

A Park and Ride lot are available, free of charge, at the Hubley Centre in Tantallon.

How Many Cars can the Park & Ride Accommodate?

The lot can accommodate approximately 185 cars.

How much does the MetroX service cost?

Cash Fares

- > Adult \$3.25
- > Child/Senior \$2.50
- > Student \$3.25

Monthly Pass

- > Adult \$100

Can I use conventional or MetroLink passes? What about tickets and transfers?

- > Additional fare required with MetroPass, Upass or transfer \$1
- > Additional fare with MetroLink passes or transfers \$0.50

What is the MetroX schedule?

- > Providing one-way direct service inbound on #103 to Downtown Halifax on Abermarle Street (formerly Market Street); with easy access to Scotia Square, trips beginning at 5:58 am, 6:28 am, 7:03 am, 7:35 am, and the last trip departing at 8:03 am.
- > Three two-directional afternoon trips beginning at 12:30 pm, 2 pm and 3:25 pm from Hubley Centre to downtown.
- > Peak afternoon one-way service begins at Scotia Square at 4:15 pm, with 30 minute service outbound until 6:50 pm.

Where can I purchase a pass?

You can pick up your MetroX passes at the following locations beginning August 20.

- > Sobeys' Customer Service at Hubley Centre, Upper Tantallon
- > Lawton's Drug at Scotia Square

> Shopper's Drug Mart at Spring Garden Road

Are there any bike racks on the MetroX buses?

Each MetroX station will have bike racks and lockers, with bike lanes available near of each station. Every MetroX bus will be equipped with a bike rack.

What's the bus like?

The MetroX buses are different than standard city buses; specifically built and designed for passenger comfort and safety, with individual reclining seats and air conditioning.

Is it sitting loads only?

No, MetroX will accept standing passengers.

Can MetroX accommodate a wheelchair?

One wheelchair can be accommodated by a lift at the rear of the bus.
