Trevor Oliver, Compliance Officer II gave a presentation on Case #CF 2022 5969, property located at 61 Farrell Street, Dartmouth, showing photographs of the property taken July 12, 2022 and responded to questions of clarification from the Standing Committee.

Catherine Anne Pellerin, property owner provided a statement and responded to questions of clarification from the Standing Committee regarding their physical inability to complete the demolition, a quote received for the demolition, potential family assistance with the demolition, access to provincial financial assistance, other funding options, internal contents, and the desire to remove the structure.

Karen MacDonald, Senior Solicitor clarified the role of the Appeals Standing Committee regarding financial implications of demolitions.

THAT the Appeals Standing Committee finds the property to be dangerous or unsightly as per section 3(q) of the Charter and as per section 356 of the Charter, orders demolition of the accessory structures including but not limited to, the removal of all demolition debris, backfilling of any foundation or crawl space, and disconnecting any and all utility connections to the standard set by each respective utility service provider, so as to leave the property in a neat, tidy, environmentally compliant and safe condition within thirty (30) days after the Order is posted in a conspicuous place upon the property or personally served upon the owner. Otherwise, the Municipality will exercise its rights as set forth under Part XV (15) of the Charter.
