14.1.1 Award – Request for Proposals (RFP) P14-360, Public Wifi

Ms. Amanda Whitewood, Director of Finance and ICT and Chief Financial Officer, Ms. Sarah Teal, Acting Manager of Strategy and Delivery, and Mr. Stephen Terry, Senior Procurement Consultant provided the staff presentation regarding Public Wifi as set out in the staff report dated January 20, 2017.

Councillor Zurawski joined the meeting at 2:13 p.m.

MOVED by Councillor Mason, seconded by Councillor Mancini

THAT Halifax Regional Council:

- 1. Award RFP P14-360, Public Wifi to the highest scoring proponent, Bell Aliant for a five (5) year period at a total cost of \$2,631,665 including net HST as outlined in the Financial Implications section of the staff report dated January 20, 2017.
- 2. Direct the CAO to execute an amendment and schedule to the existing master agreement with Bell Aliant subject to the final negotiation of terms acceptable to the CAO, receipt of Ministerial approval, and approval to form and authority by Legal Services.
- 3. Delegate authority to approve increases and changes to the services, as outlined in the RFP, to the CAO or his delegate, subject to budget availability.

Council entered into a discussion with Ms. Whitewood, Ms. Teal, and Mr. Terry responding to questions of clarification, noting the following:

- The proposal is to use Bell Aliant Fibre infrastructure, which would deliver a connection speed of approximately 5.3G;
- Staff may request cost estimates related to expanding the service to other areas of interest; however these estimates could not be evaluated as part of the proposal without reopening the Request for Proposals; and
- Bell Aliant would collect information regarding usage, but not personal information. The information collected would be provided to the municipality in aggregate.

Several councillors spoke to the benefits of free wireless connectivity to residents, tourists, and the business community. Some Members acknowledged that the proposal is not ideal; however, they expressed support for moving forward and developing a foundation for further expansion.

Other councillors expressed the following reservations:

- The proposed geographical scope is more restricted than anticipated;
- It is unclear how much revenue may be generated through advertising; and
- There are risks associated with contracting the service to a telecommunications company, and it may be preferable to develop a municipality-owned and operated broadband service.
