14.1 CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER

14.1.1 Case 21639 – Initiation of Planning Document Amendments - Margeson Drive Master Plan - Margeson Drive and the Highway #101 Interchange, Middle Sackville

18.1 Councillor Cleary

"TAKE NOTICE that, at the next meeting of Halifax Regional Council on December 11, 2018, I propose to move that Halifax Regional Council request a staff report on potentially creating new development charges for and /or regulating trees to be cut down on land that is developed for residential, commercial, and institutional purposes. The report should assess the advantages and disadvantages and the authority Halifax has to bring in such fees and regulation, given the enormous quantitative and qualitative benefits of trees as outlined in the Urban Forest Master Plan."
