Notwithstanding the purpose and sections 33 and 34 of this Administrative Order, for the 2020-2021 fiscal year, grants may be provided by the community organization for Musquodoboit Harbour without a contribution agreement or approval of Council if:

(a) the cumulative amounts of the grants do not exceed \$5,000; and

(b) the recipient of each grant is either a non-profit organization registered with the Registry of Joint Stock Companies, or a registered Canadian charitable organization.

THAT Halifax Regional Council request an expedited staff report on providing safe mobility through an inexpensive, tactical, and temporary installation of bike lanes and active transportation routes along the lines of the already approved minimum grid network in the Integrated Mobility Plan or nearby, easily implemented streets.

The Chief Administrative Officer explained that the Municipality was taking a surgical approach and adjusting service levels as more information became available on reopening the economy and lifting restrictions, in response to provincial direction. A Task Force comprised of Planning and Development and Transportation and Public Works staff has been established to look at temporary and permanent infrastructure measures such as the removal of push buttons from high traffic crosswalks, widening sidewalks and the implementation of the AAA Bikeway Network to address social distancing.

Councillors also asked for information on cities which have expressed regret with implementing temporary infrastructure measures to address social distancing.

THAT Halifax Regional Council make a statement supporting the Canadian Urban Transit Association's (CUTA) request to the federal government for emergency funding due to COVID-19 expenses as follows:

1) \$400 million a month in revenue relief to keep services running as farebox and other revenue drops by up to 100 percent.

2) A fund to help systems maintain liquidity in the period before revenue relief can arrive. CUTA estimates as many as 40 percent of systems may require bridge funding over the coming months. The association hopes these systems can access \$1.2 billion to help them keep the buses and trains running.

3) Support to cover costs of disinfectants and protective equipment for employees.

4) That a copy of the statement be sent to the Prime Minster and Minister of Finance.
