Jesse Morton, Planner II with Regional Planning, gave a presentation of how staff decided the property, 6215 Coburg Road, was considered for a Heritage Property designation and noted the property received a positive recommendation from staff.

The property owner thanked staff for their hard work and noted since finding evidence that the home was over 100 years old, their next steps include restoring exterior façade.

First Reading was given on January 26, 2021.

Sean Gillis, Planner II, gave a presentation regarding Case 22332.

Mayor Savage opened the public hearing and invited the applicant to address Council.

Chris Markides and Greg Zwicker, of Zwicker Zareski Architecture and Planning (ZZap) on behalf of applicant, gave a presentation regarding the Case 22332.

Mayor Savage reviewed the rules of procedure for public hearings and opened the public hearing for registered speakers wishing to speak on the matter.

Josh McNeil, a resident of Halifax, expressed concerns regarding the proposed height of the towers, current and future pressures on local parking, limited setbacks from residential properties fronting Birkdale Crescent, current and future pressures on existing schools, and construction noise. The speaker noted that in spite of the concerns expressed, they were impressed with the applicant's attention to these concerns having listened to the presentation.

Bill Campbell, a resident of Halifax, supported rejecting the proposal in favour of Regional Council developing a comprehensive area plan for future development. The speaker stated that there was a lack of active transportation amenities attached to the current proposal, expressed concerns regarding the increase of concentrated density and a lack of attention to tree preservation and stated that the proposal risks creating unnecessary commercial space within the neighbourhood with insufficient details regarding the regulation of hours of business.

Bruce E. Smith, a resident of Clayton Park, spoke in opposition to the proposed development. The speaker expressed concerns related to spot zoning, insufficient parking allowances, and a concern that rezoning will serve to open the broader area up for future high-rise development impacting existing vegetation by blocking sunlight.

Don Buck, a resident of Clayton Park, spoke in opposition to the proposed development. The speaker expressed concerns regarding the expansion of allowable density within the local area, the proposed height of the development, the possible displacement of existing lower rental housing in the area, parking concerns, threats to the existing greenbelt, and insufficient setbacks.

Barbara MacLean, a resident of Halifax, expressed concern over the development of the proposed park space noting that there had recently been several pedestrian injuries.

Chris Markides and Michael Williams, a representative of the applicant, responded to comments relating to parking allowances, integration of active transportation amenities, setbacks, and pressures on existing schools.

a. Create a new designation and zone to permit high density redevelopment at 210 & 214 Willett Street, Halifax;

b. Amend the zoning for certain low-density residential properties to better match existing development, except that 210 and 212 Lacewood Drive and PID 40293342, located between 236 and 212 Lacewood Drive as shown on Map C-1 (as revised) shall remain zoned R-4; and c. Rezone parkland to the Park and Institutional Zone;

2. Direct the Chief Administrative Officer to continue to consider amendments to the Dunbrack Street study area and commercially zoned properties south of Radcliff Street and adjacent to Dunbrack Street through a comprehensive review process, such as the Regional Plan or Plan and By-law Simplification Program (Suburban Plan), that provides greater detail and consideration of the following:

a. appropriate building heights, building forms, site design and the impact of traffic, including from full build-out of potential development, including wind and shadow analysis;

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b. improving transition to lower density properties, including appropriate setbacks, side yards;

c. revising parking standards;

d. a greater portion of dwelling units to have two or more bedrooms;

e. proposing better active transportation routes and new public green space;

f. creating a density bonus regime like that used in the Centre Plan to fund local area

improvements and affordable housing;

g. options for inclusionary zoning; and

h. commercial space including the quantity, form and use.
