The Chair called the meeting to order at 9:32 a.m.

4. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Karen McKendry, Ecology Action Centre, spoke before the Budget Committee regarding the Parks and Recreation 2021/22 Budget & Business Plan, specifically Parks and Recreation's parkland acquisition priorities in larger regional parks given the positive impact of these lands on the environment.

Ross Jefferson, President & CEO, Discover Halifax, spoke before the Budget Committee and answered questions regarding the allocation of special support for event development in the Parks and Recreation 2021/22 Budget & Business Plan as these supports will assist with the recovery of the tourism industry when public health restrictions ease.

Kellie Allen, Director, Roots and Boots Forest School, spoke before the Budget Committee and answered questions regarding outdoor education programs for youth and alternative funding options to support the measures contained within the Parks and Recreation 2021/22 Budget & Business Plan.

Wendy MacDonald, Halifax, spoke before the Budget Committee regarding the need in District 12 for functional parkland, indoor and outdoor recreational facilities and programs.

Colin May, Dartmouth, spoke before the Budget Committee regarding the presence of "no winter maintenance" signs on the Dartmouth Common's pedestrian pathways and the parks at Bicentennial school. May also requested signage for the Dartmouth Common informing cyclists that pedestrians have priority on the pathways.
