- Adopt Administrative Order 2019-010-ADM, Respecting Recreation User Charges, the purpose of which is to set policy direction for staff to develop user charges, classify facilities and services, formalize the Affordable Access Program as well as to provide direction for the fees to be maintained/updated moving forward; and
- 3. Move amendments to Administrative Order 58, Respecting the Delegation of Certain Authorities, the purpose of which is to repeal provisions dealing with rentals that will fall under By-law U-100 and to address several housekeeping amendments.

TAKE NOTICE that, at a future meeting of Halifax Regional Council, I intend to propose amendments for approval to Administrative Order 2020-009-ADM, Respecting Covid-19, the purpose of which is to support the transition period back to in-person public hearings and certain types of engagement practices while also acknowledging the continued uncertainty around public health regulations as well as clarify the process by which meetings will be determined to be virtual or in-person and their advertising.
