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To qualify for the Halifax Transit low income transit pass program, applicants must:

- have an household income less than \$33,000 per year
- not receive a transportation subsidy under the Nova Scotia Employment Support and Income Assistance program

A household is all family members living in the same home related by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption. Roommates are not considered part of the household. Adults are considered persons 18 years and over.

All adult members of the household must provide a copy of 2016's Notice of Assessment or Proof of Income Statement from the Canada Revenue Agency. This includes members of the household not applying for the program. Full-time adult students are not required to submit a Notice of Assessment or Proof of income. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Terms and Conditions:

- To be eligible for the low income transit pass program, your household income (Line C in Section 3) must be less than \$33,000 per year.
- The applicants do not receive transportation subsidy under the Nova Scotia Employment Support and Income Assistance program you do not have a copy of your 2016 Notice of Assessment, you may substitute a Proof of Income Statement ('Option C"). To view and print a Proof of Income Statement or 'Option 'C' ", visit www.cra-arc.gc.ca Instructions on obtaining this document may be found on the Canada Revenue Agency website noted above.
- For all adult family members, a copy of 2016's Canada Revenue Agency Personal Income Tax Notice of Assessment or Proof of Income Statement (Option C) must be included with this application. Full-time adult students are not required to submit a Notice of Assessment or Proof of income.
- The 2017/2018 Low Income Transit Pass program is capped at 1000 participants. It is recommended applications be submitted as soon as possible.
- Incomplete applications will not be considered.

Frequently Asked Questions:

What is the Canada Revenue Agency Notice of Assessment?

A Notice of Assessment shows the result of the assessment of your tax return. It is sent to you after Canada Revenue Agency processes your tax return.

At a minimum, your Notice of Assessment will contain:

- Account summary
- Tax assessment summary
- Explanation of changes and other important information
- RRSP/PRPP deduction limit statement

A 2016 Notice of Assessment for each household member is required for those 18 years and over that lives in the household. Total income before tax is shown on Line 150 of the Notice of Assessment.

What is a Proof of Income Statement ('Option C')?

A Proof of Income Statement is a quick and easy online-accessible document that provides your 2016 income information. You may find more information on the Proof of Income Statement ('Option C') at www.cra-arc.gc.ca

Combined Gross Household Income?

Combined Gross Household Income is all income earned or received by adult household residents in 2016. A copy of the **2016 Income Tax Notice of Assessment** must be included as proof of income for all adult members of the household (18 and over). T-4s are NOT an acceptable proof of income.

What is a household?

For the purposes of this application, a household is all family members living in the same home related by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption (including children). Roommates are not considered part of the household.

What is a household income?

Household income is the total income of all adult family members living in the same home related by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption (including the person applying). Adults are considered persons 18 years and over.
