Applications returned before August 15th will have the rebate credited to the final tax bill. Any credits will be applied to the outstanding balances as per HRM's Collection Policy prior to a refund being issued. Please note if your taxes are paid by your mortgage company or you pay your taxes through pre-authorized payment (a scheduled payment to HRM from your bank account), a refund will be issued to you after the tax bill due date of October 31st. Most refunds should be issued to homeowners as of December 15, 2018. **All applications must be submitted by December 31st, 2018**.

Application Checklist

Your application must be complete to be processed. Make sure to include the following:

- □ Proof of gross household income from Canada Revenue Agency (Notice of Assessment line 150 and/or proof of net world income) as well as your statement of business and/or rental activities section of your tax return.
- \Box Proof of rental income/expenses not claimed on personal income tax.
- \Box Application signed by the owner(s) who have title to the property.
- □ Proof of power of attorney, personal representative, guardian, trustee, or living interest must be included unless you have previously submitted it.

Other Housing Assistance Programs

There are other assistance programs at the Provincial or Municipal level that you may qualify for.

Provincial Property Tax Rebate for Seniors Program: This program is for seniors who have been receiving the Guaranteed Income Supplement in January of the application year. Criteria requires you to have paid your property taxes from the prior year in full. A receipt from Halifax Regional Municipality showing property taxes are paid in full is required by the program. For further program information please visit https://novascotia.ca/sns/access/individuals/consumer-awareness/property-tax-rebate-for-seniors.asp. Applicants to this program receive a rebate on half of their taxes paid to a maximum of \$800. Applications are available from **Service Nova Scotia (902) 424-5200 or 211 or toll free at 1-800-670-4357**.

Provincial Home Repairs Programs: There are approximately 15 different programs available to low income homeowners and seniors which will assist in the repair and maintenance of your home, including but not limited to roof replacement, upgrades to wiring, windows, doors, ramps, and furnace replacement. For information on these programs call **Nova Scotia Department of Community Services (Housing) (902) 424-5110 or toll free at 1-800-774-5130**.

Heating Assistance Rebate Program: The Heating Assistance Rebate Program (HARP) helps with the cost of home heating for low-income Nova Scotians who pay for their own heat. Rebates range from \$100 to \$200. You can apply between October 2018 and March 31, 2019. Service Nova Scotia (902) 424-5200 or 211 or toll free at 1-800-670-4357.

Home Warming Program: The Home Warming Program is fully funded by the Province of Nova Scotia and Nova Scotia Power it is geared to low-income homeowners and 100 % free. Homeowners are offered no-charge energy assessments and free home upgrades. The home must be owned and occupied for a minimum of 1 year after applying to the program. You must include proof of income for all residents over the age of 18 and a property tax bill or notice of assessment from Provincial Valuation Services Corporation (PVSC).
