

HAMMONDS PLAINS ROAD CONSTRUCTION

The Halifax Regional Municipality is advising residents and motorists that continuing road construction will take place Monday on Hammonds Plains Road between Lucasville Road and Kingswood Drive. Crews will be on site weekdays from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. until August 18. There will be an altered centreline with stop-and-go traffic during this work. Motorists should expect delays in the area and are asked to take alternative routes, if possible.

STORMWATER RATE CHANGES

On April 12th, 2017 the Nova Scotia Utility and Review Board (NSUARB) approved a number of stormwater rate changes including those listed below. The changes have taken effect as of July 1st. 2017.

These changes will allow for a tiered billing system based on each properties impervious area (concrete, ashphalt driveway, roofs etc.)

These changes will mean a rate reduction for 88% of Halifax Water customers. Halifax Water has also made significant improvements to their website to make more information about stormwater charges available and accessible for residents. Check out the website today for more information.
