Information Report for the OIC Halifax District HRM Board of Police Commissioners' Meeting August 21st, 2017

June - July Training:

• **44** Members received some form of training in June and July 2017 combined, accumulating a total of **587** hours. Examples of training received were Phased Interview, Radar, Resolving Conflict, Surveillance etc.

Victim Services:

- The RCMP Victim Services program in Halifax District is overseen by a Coordinator and includes a roster of 8 volunteers. They follow up with victims of crime via telephone to offer support and referral services. The range of incidents they respond to is very broad and can include suicide, sudden death, assault, domestic violence, sexual assault, break & enter, etc.
- For the month of June and July Stats for Victim Services:
- The Victim Services Coordinator reviewed **1300** files for the period.
- Victim Services volunteers followed up on **113** files with **126** victims in total.
- The Victim Services Coordinator is monitoring **24** files for referrals.
- There was **1** file referred to the Department of Justice's Victim Services.
- Six high risk files were identified.

Lower Sackville - July 27th – At 6:42 call received for a stolen ³/₄ ton pickup truck with trailer, construction equipment in trailer, total value of truck, trailer and equipment estimated at \$100,000. Keys for truck were removed from homeowner's garage from previous B & E two weeks prior. At 23:20 the truck and trailer were recovered undamaged on a CN access road. SUI.

Cole Harbour - July 28th - At 00:55 hrs. traffic stop conducted on ATV driving with no headlights in Lake Echo Trailer park. Obvious signs of impairment, 55yr. old male blew 210/190 and was issued four SOTs under Off Highway vehicle Act, No Headlights, Helmet, Insurance and Registration. Male has **NINE** previous impaired convictions, **SIX** Prohibited Driving convictions and **TWO** lifetime Canada Wide Driving Prohibitions.

Tantallon - June 26th - 911 call, females in distress somewhere on hiking trail on Pockwock Rd. Members walked around nearby trails until two females located, one bleeding from head, other with large gash on leg. EHS attended and transported to hospital.

<u>Eastern Shore</u> - July 24^{th} – B & E into Dept. of Transportation shed in Musquodoboit Harbour, several thousands of dollars of tools and equipment taken, SUI.

July 15th - Boat reported missing in Sheet Harbour. A community member found the boat while cleaning up the shoreline; the boat has been stripped. SUI
