Motion for Community Council to Consider:	
Request a staff report on preparing and installing NO WAKE ZONE/ SAFE BOATING signage on HRM Lakes, and; monitoring of HRM Lakes to enforce the speed limits and safe boating practices to ensure public safety.	
Reason:	
Increasing use of speed boats, jet skis, water skiing, stand-up paddle boarding, kayaking, canoeing etc. on Lake Charles. Many residents concerned about safety. HRM currently has two pieces of legislation concerning specific lakes in HRM
