



3 Significance of Builder/Architect

- George Allan Ross and Robert Henry MacDonald of the Ross and MacDonald architecture firm
 - Designed many notable buildings across Canada
 - Worked with Thomas Adams to reconstruct the Richmond district of Halifax following the 1917 Halifax Explosion

Offered a variety of designs that were cheap and

easy to build



4 Architectural Merit

Construction Type or Building Technology

- Many of the Ross and MacDonald designs built in the North End were constructed of hydrostone
- 2 ½ storey wood-framed building
- Wooden shingles
- Steep pitched front gable roof with hipped gable
- Decorative sticks
- Brick chimney
- Shed dormers
- Central verandah supported by fluted pilasters



4 Architectural Merit

Style

- Outstanding example of Hydrostone architecture
- Very similar to a D9 Ross and MacDonald house


