Subject: Back to Our Roots Urban Farm Market						
Motion for Council to Consider:						
That Regional Council request a staff report considering a pilot project allowing the Back to Our Roots Urban Farm to hold their weekly market at the Woodside Ferry Terminal from June – September.						
Reason: The Back to Our Roots Urban Farm is a project of Partners for Care, which is the charity arm of the Nova Scotia Hospital. It operates in partnership with the Hospital and Mental Health Foundation. The organization uses gardening to promote physical, mental and environmental health. They offer skills training and educational workshops on growing vegetables without pesticides; making healthy food more accessible to hospital clients and staff; and creating a space for growing food that's supportive and welcoming. They have a market garden, where volunteers work to grow food for their weekly market stand. The market operates from 3:30 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Thursdays and the profits go directly back into their programming. Last year they operated from a parking lot adjacent to the Woodside Ferry Terminal.
