

Are You 'Emergency Ready'?

Emergency Preparedness Week began on Sunday and Halifax Regional Fire & Emergency (HRFE's) Emergency Management Division is urging you to become 'emergency ready'.

There are several questions residents should ask themselves as they determine if they're ready to react with a moment's notice.

No one knows the risks in your home and around your neighbourhood better than you. Analyze the situation through the eyes of someone who will need to act quickly. What are the potential hazards?

The Emergency Management Division's role in an emergency is to ensure the safety and security of residents, their properties, and the environment by providing a prompt and coordinated response to an emergency. Residents play a big role in ensuring their own safety as well.

Being 'emergency ready' requires examination of three key areas:

- Know the risks
- Make a plan
- Get a kit

Every household needs an emergency plan. Members of the home may not be together when an emergency occurs. Plan how to meet or how to contact one another, and discuss what you would do in different situations. In the case of an emergency, you should be prepared for 72 hours. There may be certain situations where you are not able to, or it is not safe to evacuate your home. You should be prepared to be self-sufficient in your home for 72 hours (or seven to 10 days in a health emergency).

HRFE's Emergency Management Division is running a contest to raise awareness of emergency readiness. Up for grabs are 18 emergency kits (approx. retail value \$30). To participate in the contest, take our <u>emergency preparedness quiz</u>. All entrants who answer the questions correctly will be eligible for the draw.

2018-19 Municipal Budget Approved

On April 24th, Regional Council approved the 2018-19 budget with a 1.975% increase to the average residential property tax bill. By all measures, it's a modest tax cost increase that is:

- below anticipated inflation and growth in personal incomes
- among one of the lowest compared to other large cities including Ottawa, London, Kitchener and Edmonton
- in the bottom four of Canada's 22 largest municipalities for its impact on the average residential tax bill

The budget, as adopted, reflects our best effort to provide a balanced approach to using taxpayer dollars in the most responsible manner possible, while at the same time recognizing and addressing the growing needs of

our municipality as we move forward. It also concludes the first multi-year budget plan and the related two years of financial forecasting that adapted to the ongoing changes in assumptions and circumstances.

A key driver in this Regional Council's budget is accountability, not just to taxpayers, but to ourselves. Performance excellence and results are at the core of this budget and will be as we move into the future. We will discover new, innovative ways to do more with less.
