One of the first areas being updated are rules of the road, including distracted driving, speed limits and bicycling. The new act, expected to be introduced in the Legislature this fall, governs and regulates the registration and identification of motor vehicles and the use of provincial highways and roads. This includes driver's licences, the registration and inspection of vehicles, traffic laws and equipment standards.
