AREA RATES UPDATE—UNDER REVIEW

HRM Council has directed staff to begin a broad consultation with the various community associations, that have an area rate. This is to consider an update and to combine the current HRM Recreation Area Rate Policy and Interim Area Rates Guidelines into one policy to create a New Area Rate Administrative Order for the 2019-2020 fiscal year. With respect to the Musquodoboit Harbour Area Common Rate, it will remain in existence to allow sufficient time to give notice that there will only be one year for a community group to establish itself as the lead agency to undertake public consultations, develop guidelines and create a business case and purpose for the continuance of this rate, and, if this consultation does not occur, then this area rate will not be renewed in 2019-20.
