LUCASVILLE GREENWAY WALKING / BIKING TRAIL



I am pictured here, with Councillor Craig, as we absorb updates concerning the exciting new Lucasville Greenway Walking/Biking Trail project at a recent meeting held at the Wallace Lucas Community Centre.

The importance of projects like the Lucasville Greenway Walking/Biking Trail is that it fits perfectly with the objectives of the Halifax Greenway Network, Integrated Mobility Plan and our Active Transportation goals. Connected parks, wilderness areas, and trails provide a wide range of recreational and active transportation opportunities within reach of communities, which can help promote active lifestyles, contribute to quality of life, and stimulate economic investment.

Thanks to the dedication of the Lucasville Greenway Walking/ Biking Trail Committee (formerly the Lucasville Green Space Group), who have been working to build a trail in Lucasville since 2015.

Through volunteer-raised funds, a local Consultant (Design Point) was hired to develop a Greenway Vision on how to connect our communities by way of active transportation (cycling and walking) from Wallace Lucas Community Centre to Old Sackville Road. The goal is to build a connection to join Lucasville to Hammonds Plains and Lower Sackville, and strengthen connections within the community in Waterstone, Kingswood North, and Timber Trails.

The area outlined in red in the image above is the proposed trail area.

The cost for the greenway, including a 30% contingency, is an estimated \$3.6M (not including HST). Along with the narrow road shoulders, steep grades and utility poles, there are two major design constraints along the route between the Wallace Lucas Community Centre and the intersection with Old Sackville Road – the Sackville River crossing and the crossing of Highway 101. Both crossings will require major construction solutions and will be significant drivers of the overall cost of the project.



PET SAFETY



Please do not leave pets unattended in your vehicle during the hot summer months. You may think you are only going to be a "sec" but that quick errand may be longer than intended. The quick run into the grocery store for milk, or pet food, may end up taking 10 minutes or more if you run into an old friend and start innocently chatting; or, there is a line-up; or, a machine malfunctions. Time flies. Before you know it that

quick "sec" could be a second too long for your beloved pet.

It can take minutes – yes, MINUTES – for a pet to develop heat stroke and suffocate in a car. Most people don't realize how hot it gets in parked cars. On a 25°C day, for instance, temperatures in a car can reach 32°C degrees, if parked directly in the sun temperatures could reach 71°C!

If you can't bear to leave your pet at home, consider some alternatives to leaving him/her in the vehicle:

- Remember the drive-thru. Your pet can sit comfortably with you in your vehicle while you wait for your meal or service. Many businesses have a drive-thru window; they are not just for fast food.
- Bring a friend. If you know that you have to make stops where pets are not allowed, bring a friend along who can keep your pet company. Have your friend walk your dog, give him/her water or stay in the shade until you return.
- Shop pet friendly. More and more stores allow pets inside. If you are unsure about a retailer's rule on pets, just ask. Most pet stores allow you to bring your pooch with you, as do many other types of businesses. Make sure your dog is on a leash and wellbehaved before you take him/her along with you.

If you see a pet in immediate distress, call 911 and take directions from the call taker.

A summary offence ticket for leaving an animal unattended in a motor vehicle in conditions that could cause distress carries a fine of \$697.50.
