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Objective: To integrate the planning of the transportation network with community design to better facilitate active transportation and transit use through compact, mixed-use development

LAST QUARTER

- Working to refine boundaries of transit oriented areas in suburban communities (A14)
- Centre Plan public consultation concluded (A22, A25, A26, A27)
- Consultant investigating applying infrastructure charges to development applications to provide for capital costs to implement transit priority measures and commuter rail (A19)
- Burnside Business Park zoning is being analyzed; proposed new industrial/commercial zoning and IMP recommendations may be used as a template for business parks elsewhere (A28)

- Review and respond to the Centre Plan engagement submissions (A22, A25, A26, A27)
- Initiate the Bedford Highway Corridor Study that investigates transportation infrastructure improvements and considers the relationship between land use and transportation (A22, A121)

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Objective: Meet the needs of all ages, abilities and travel modes in the design and maintenance of streets

LAST QUARTER

- Developed a Complete Streets Toolkit for use by road designers (A31)

- Designed complete street elements for Gottingen Street in part with Provincial Connect2 funding.
- Spring Garden Road Streetscaping Pilot Project 'Stoplet' and engagement (A41-48)
- Fire truck field testing for bump outs (A38)

- SmartTrip tendered web based software to encourage ride sharing through improved coordination and application times (A56, A64)
- Continuous employee pass enrollment for Epass including 100 new employee registrations (A65)
- Low income transit pass pilot program made permanent. (A64)
- Worked with partners at CarShare Atlantic and the Province of Nova Scotia to better understand the role of Car Sharing services in Nova Scotia (A66, A68)
- Partnered with the Department of Community Services to enable Employment Support and Income Assistance (ESIA) clients and their dependents unlimited access to Halifax Transit service (A57)

- Discuss SmartTrip with the Nova Scotia Health Authority to promote sustainable commuting for employees in Halifax (A64)
- Bring forward changes to By-law P1000 respecting on street parking permits which will include special permits and zones dedicated to carshare entities (A66-68)
