## **PLEASE THINK BEFORE YOU PARK!**



We either love it or hate it but snow is a reality in HRM for at least four months of the year. I recently met with our supervisors for snow removal to review concerns and problem areas from last season. Our crews spend hours in the cold, stormy weather making it safe for us to travel. I have profound respect for the work they do.

When and where you park has a significant impact on our ability to clear snow from streets and roads. Please think before you park this winter. It will help make the season a little easier on everyone.

The overnight winter parking ban is in effect every year from December 15<sup>th</sup> until March 31<sup>st</sup>; however, it is only enforced during declared weather events and clearing operations. When the ban is enforced, it restricts any on-street parking between 1 a.m. and 6 a.m. Vehicles in violation of the ban will be ticketed and/or towed.

**NOTE:** Vehicles can be towed any time during the day or night, any day of the year, if they are interfering with snow-clearing operations, as per Section 139 of the <u>Nova Scotia Motor Vehicle Act</u>.

To help avoid a ticket, as well as the inconvenience and cost of being towed, please ask yourself these four questions when considering parking on the street this winter:

- 1. Is the overnight parking ban currently being enforced?
- 2. Is your vehicle causing a safety issue?
- 3. Is it making the road impassable?
- 4. Is it impeding snow operations underway in the area?

If the answer to any of these four questions is yes, **do not** park on the street.

The easiest way to know when the parking ban will be enforced is to <u>register for notifications</u>. You can also email a request to <u>contact@halifax.ca</u> or <u>call</u> <u>311</u>. For those who signed up last season, you will continue to receive notifications when the ban is enforced.



## **SECONDARY SUITE / BACKYARD SUITE**

As part of HRM's approach to creating complete communities and meeting its affordable housing targets, as part of the <u>Housing and Homelessness</u> <u>Partnership</u>, the municipality is considering permitting secondary suites, and backyard suites. Secondary suites would be enabled in most single unit dwellings and backyard suites would be permitted where specific requirements can be met.

**Secondary suites** are separate dwelling units that are completely contained within a home, sometimes called in-law suites, or basement apartments.

**Backyard suites**, sometimes referred to as garden suites or carriage houses, are separate free-standing buildings, either built overtop an accessory structure like a garage, or simply on their own.



The municipality is also considering widely permitting secondary suites and backyard suites throughout the region. Allowing secondary and backyard suites more broadly is intended to support the creation of complete communities as well as meet affordable housing targets for Halifax that were adopted under the Housing and Homelessness Partnership. It was an honour to meet Mr. Charles (Chuck) Marohn at the Nova Scotia Federation of Municipalities (NSFM) fall conference held in Halifax November 6<sup>th</sup> – 9<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Marohn, a Professional Engineer and member of the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP), presented the keynote address "Curbside Chat". He is the Founder and President of Strong Towns and author of *Thoughts on Building Strong Towns* – Volumes 1-3. He also hosts the STRONG TOWNS PODCAST. In 2017 he was named one of the 10 Most Influential Urbanists of all time by Planetizen.

The *Curbside Cha*t presentation explained how/why many North American municipalities found themselves in decline even though they had experienced periods of promising growth. The reasons were: a) the model of development - short-




term gains over long-term prosperity, b) top-down investment rather than bottom-up investment outside sources rather than investment in our neighbours and ourselves, c) The presentation also focussed on ways to reverse the negative trajectory and to become more resilient for communities who want to be financially strong in an uncertain future.

## WE WANT YOUR IDEAS ON HOW TO IMPROVE CROSSWALK SAFETY



We want ideas from the people who walk, drive, and bike through crosswalks every day. If you have an idea on **how you can make** our crosswalks safer, download a <u>submission form</u>, complete and submit it after reading the <u>official rules</u>. While we want everyone with a bright idea to be engaged in the initiative, **we can only accept proposals from** (and make funding payments to) **qualifying associations** residing in the Halifax Regional Municipality **that will implement the proposal**. Qualifying associations are a charitable, nursing, medical, athletic, educational, environmental, cultural, community, fraternal, recreational, religious, sporting or social organization.

The qualifying associations must also be registered for at least one (1) year prior to **January 3, 2019 at 4:00 p.m. AT** (Note: registration must be current; organizations whose registration has expired, in default or revoked will be ineligible to be a Qualifying Association).

Individuals with a bright idea for crosswalk safety must engage and partner with a qualifying association (as described above) to complete an eligible submission.

Submissions kicked off with Crosswalk Safety Awareness Day on **November 19, 2018 with the deadline** to submit of **January 3, 2019.** Winners will be announced in March 2019. Funding amounts are: four awards of \$5,000; six awards of \$2,500; and fifteen awards of \$1,000. Funding for successful proposals will begin in April 2019.
