
Site Context





1478 Carlton Street: Substantial Alteration

Queen Anne Revival / Second Empire style structure built in 1894.







1480-84 Carlton Street: Substantial Alteration

 Halifax-style symmetrical duplex built in 1860.













1494 Carlton Street: Substantial Alteration

- Second Empire style residence constructed in 1878
- Former home of Best-selling Author Margaret Saunders (1861-1947)
- A full restoration to its 19th century design is proposed.





1494 Carlton Street: Substantial Alteration



Non-Substantial Alterations

For all properties:

- Repairs and/or restoration of siding, trim and roofing
- Repair or replacement (as necessary) of windows, doors and dormers
- Rehabilitation of front and rear entry porches and stairs

5950 Spring Garden Road



- Built between 1889 and 1895
- Not specifically registered, it was consolidated with 1494 Carlton Street in 1989, thus assuming its registered status
- It was attached to 1494 Carlton Street through a Development Agreement in 1990 and altered in appearance
- HAC has recommended that this building be considered for registration.

5950 Spring Garden Road



Timeline

1890s – Building constructed

1970s – Alterations to building exterior

1981 – Registration of 1494 Carlton St.

1985 – Designation of Carlton Streetscape

1989 – Consolidated with 1494 Carlton and Development agreement adopted allowing conversion to office use.
