## **Community Grants Program**

Halifax Regional Municipality's 2019 Community Grants Program is now accepting applications. The application deadline is **March 31st**.

The Community Grants Program provides annual cash grants to registered non-profit organizations and charities located throughout the Halifax region. There are two types of grants:

a project grant of up to \$5,000a capital grant of up to \$25,000

At present, the program provides assistance to specific types of projects in the following categories:

- Arts and Crafts
- Diversity and Inclusion
- Environment
- •Emergency Assistance and Neighbourhood Safety
- •History
- •Housing
- •Leisure
- Recreation

# Change your clocks, change your batteries

March 10<sup>th</sup> is the time we turn our clocks ahead an hour to start Daylight Saving Time.

When you "spring ahead" an hour with your clocks you should also change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms. While you're at it, check the expiry on the back of the alarms. The National Fire Protection Association recommends smoke alarms be replaced every 10 years.

And while we encourage people to change alarm batteries when adjusting the time on your clocks, you should test your smoke or carbon monoxide alarms once a month, to ensure they are still working.

Halifax Regional Fire Services has a program called, 'Alarmed and Ready'. The purpose of the program is to provide a smoke or carbon monoxide alarm for those who do not have the financial means to obtain one. Call 311 to place a request for an alarm.

This program also gives our front-line firefighters an opportunity to educate the public on the importance of an early warning device in the home, and to demonstrate to residents how to maintain and test their alarms.

The First Responders Society is an incorporated non-profit company established by firefighter, Andréa Speranza, in January 2006, to introduce young women aged 15- 19 to careers as first responders primarily Paramedics, Police

Officers, and Firefighters. The goal is that young women will leave with a sense of empowerment and the confidence to believe that they **can** achieve any goal, career or dream they desire.

The camp is 100% free. To be accepted into camp you must write an essay on one of two topics: how you can improve someone else's life that is less fortunate, or; how you can improve your community. Instead of paying cash, you have to do what you've proposed in your essay. The only limitation is your imagination. This illustrates how hard work creates opportunities. It teaches to be thankful for what you have and to respect others that have less as well as teaching the value of helping others.

<u>Camp Courage</u> accepts only 24 participants each year. Entrance essays are due March 31st!

## **Trap Neuter Return Program**

In 2017/18 Regional Council approved a 5-year pilot grant program to assist with the spay and neutering of feral cats. The program provides funding of up to \$50,000 annually to the Nova Scotia SPCA and Spay Day HRM to trap, neuter, spay and return cats.

Trap/Neuter and Return (TNR) programs are defined as programs through which freeroaming, unowned cats are humanely trapped, spayed or neutered, medically treated and subsequently returned to the locations where they were found. The objective of TNR is to gradually eliminate colonies by a process of "aging out." It reduces the cycle of unwanted breeding and the stress that causes on feral cats and on shelters and rescues constantly rescuing kittens from these situations.
