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By-law S-801 for Temporary Signs

- Spring of 2015, Council passed legislation to deal with the proliferation of temporary signs – S-801
- Regulations are for private land and municipally-owned land
- By-law does not permit signs in the right-of-way



Motion from Council

That Halifax Regional Council direct staff to undertake consultations with internal and external stakeholders to consider possible by-law and administrative amendments to By-law S-801, Respecting Licensing of Temporary Signs and Administrative Order 15, Respecting License, Permit and Processing Fees and prepare a recommendation report with proposed amendments for Regional Council's consideration.



Consultation

- Sign companies
- Internal staff reviewers
- Automobile Dealers' Association



Outcomes from Consultation

- Measurements for signs in the right-of-way
- Less red tape
- Fewer reviews by staff
- Assumed compliance



Recommendations

- Annual business license
 - o Exception of variable messaging mobile signs and on municipal land
- Right-of-way setback
- Variable messaging mobile signs
 - Subsection of mobile signs
 - One/property
 - o Only when business is open






- Free standing signs
 - o No license
 - Five/property private or in right-of-way





• Box signs will no longer be temporary signs. They will be permanent signs.







- License period for mobile signs or inflatables for up to 90 days after which will be a 30-day rest period.
- Community event signs on municipal property erected up to 10 days, June September and 14 days otherwise.
- Waive fees for churches and schools
- Short term event signs for 10 days
- New sign types reviewed on case by case basis



• Light standard signs now 30 square feet/2.79 m – no license



 Commercial and industrial zones fronting the Bedford Hwy within Bedford Municipal Planning Strategy
