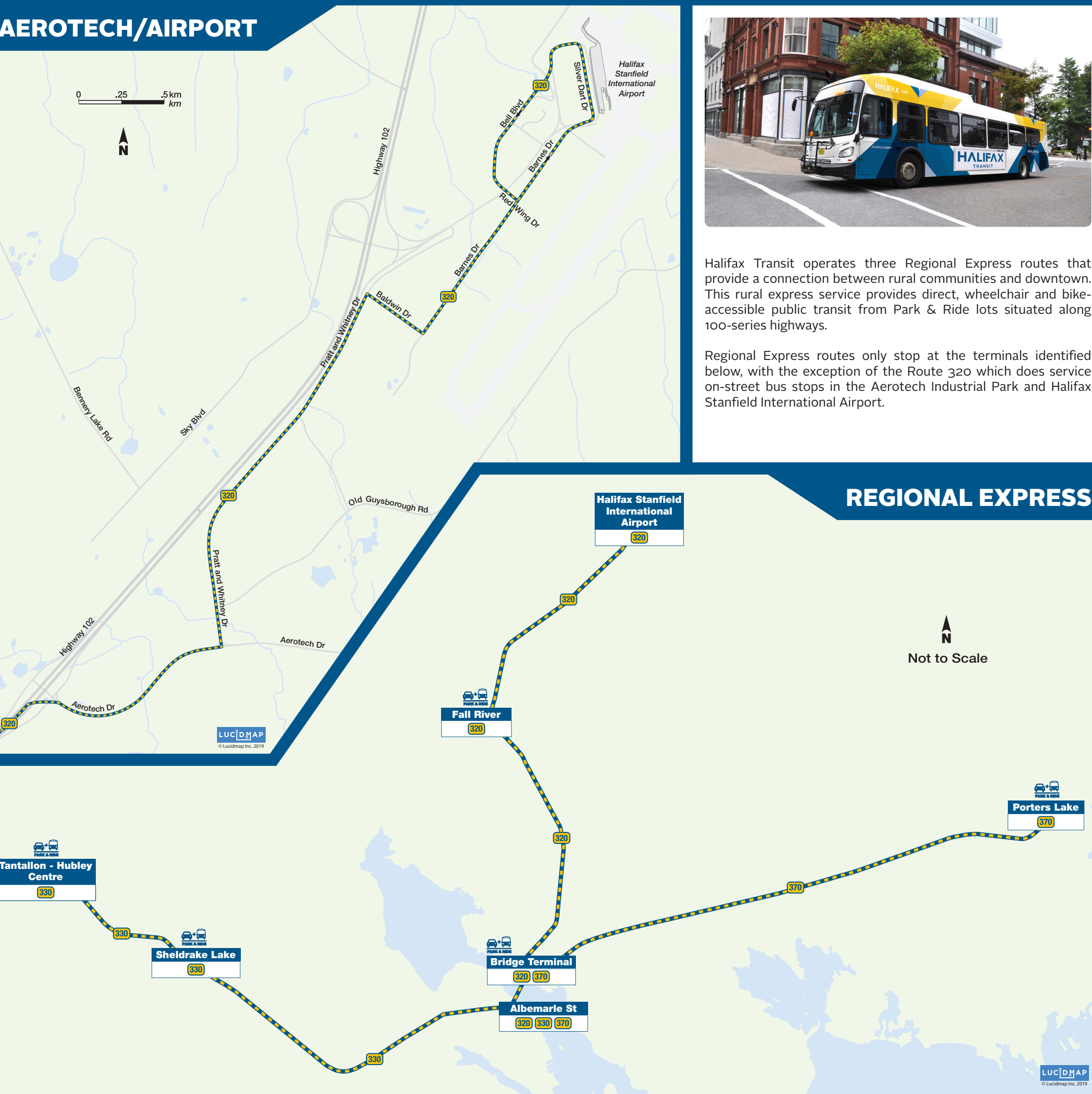
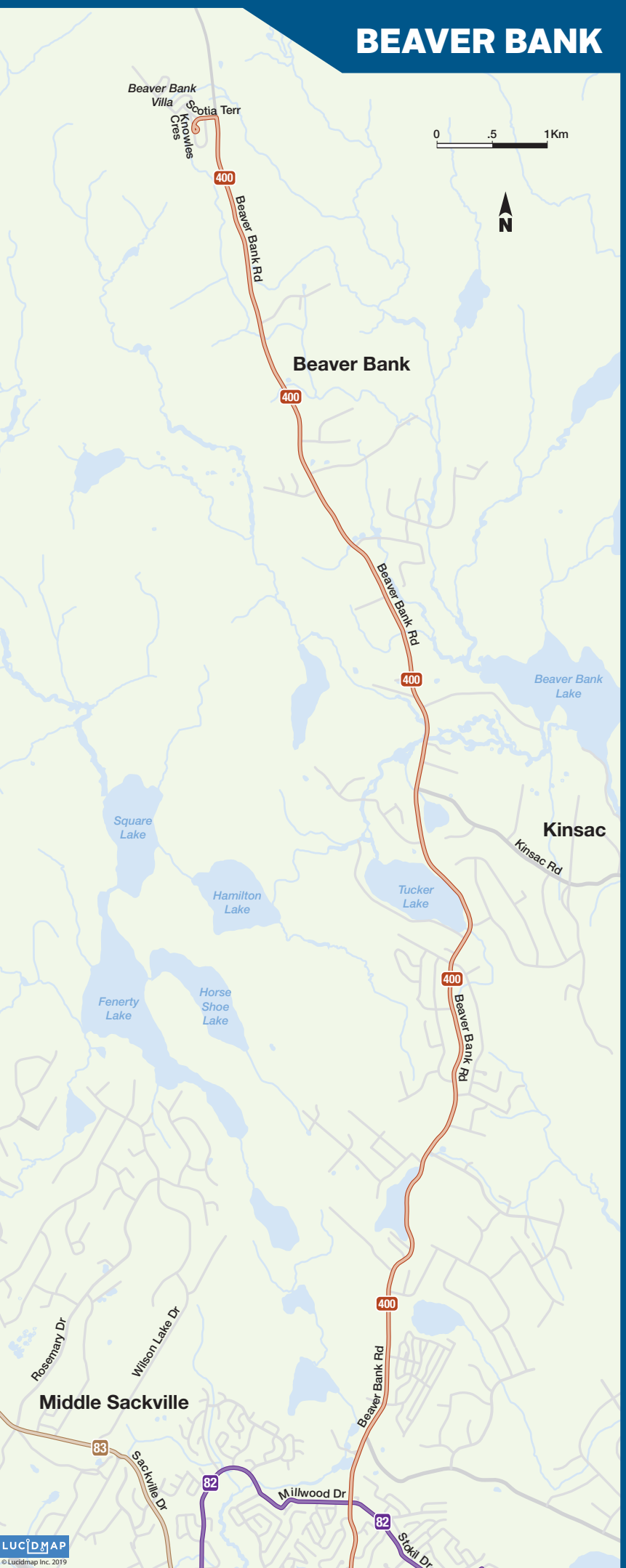
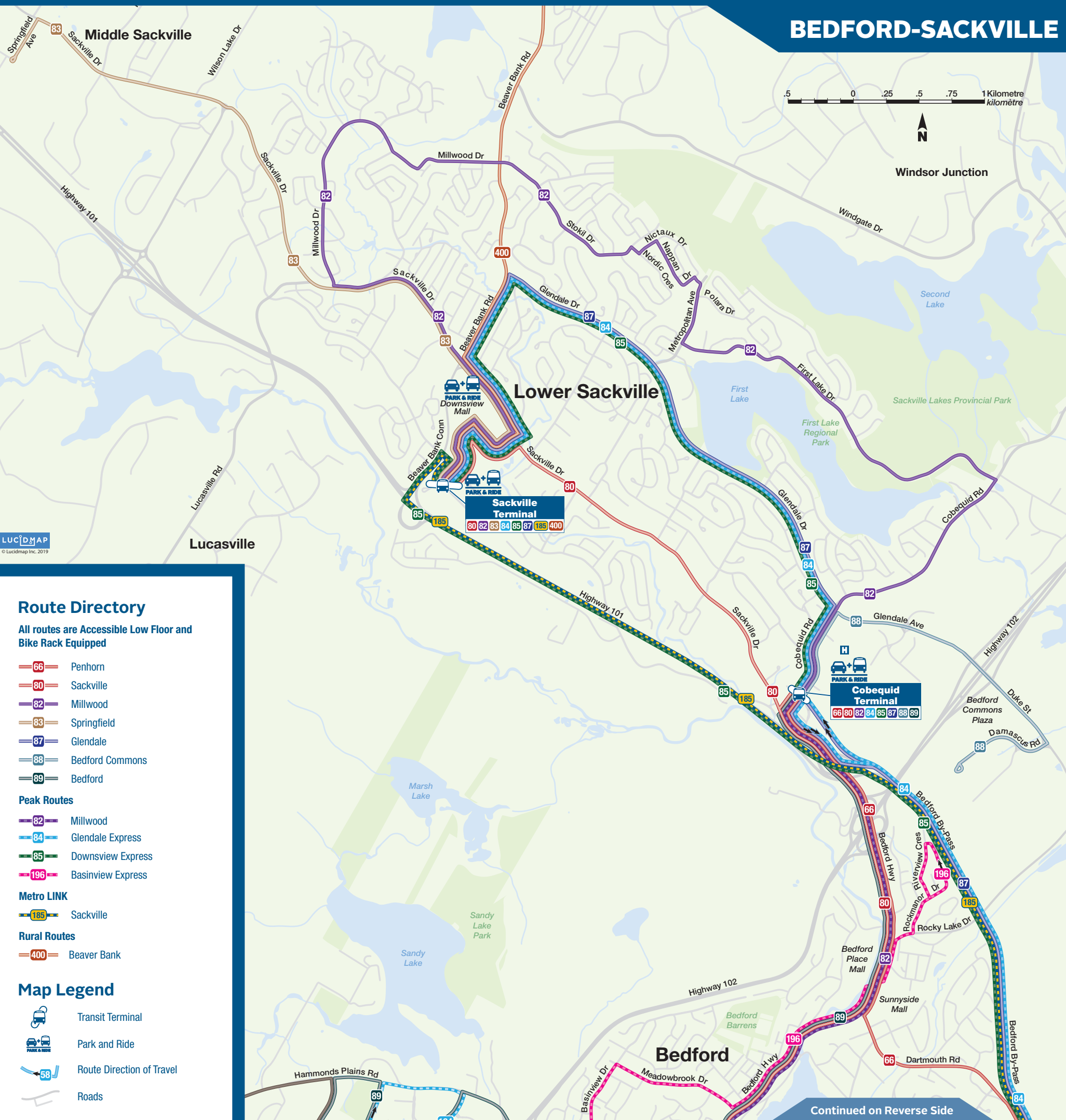


• Bus Bay Number

Halifax Transit operates three Regional Express routes that provide a connection between rural communities and downtown. This rural express service provides direct, wheelchair and bike-accessible public transit from Park & Ride lots situated along vooc-series highways.

Regional Express routes only stop at the terminals identified below, with the exception of the Route 300 which does service on-street bus stops in the Aerotech Industrial Park and Halifax Stanfield International Airport.

Policy Highlight - Food and Beverage Policy

Halifax Transit's food and beverage policy has been designed to keep buses and ferries clean and safe. Only food and drink carried within sealable (spill proof) containers are permitted on Halifax Transit buses. As there is the potential for spillage during the acceleration or deceleration of a transit bus, and as buses may decelerate rapidly to avoid traffic hazards, food of any kind may not be consumed. Beverages such as coffee may be consumed on Halifax Transit buses contingent on the use of sealable containers. Single use disposable coffee cups are not permitted. Littering caps help avoid spills that could make aisle ways unsafe. Litter must be taken off buses and ferries and disposed of responsibly.

Halifax Transit is often asked why Bus Operators are allowed to drink from a disposable cup when passengers are not. There are two reasons for this. The first is that the Operator has a cup holder installed on the bus and this greatly reduces the chances of having an on-board spill. Additionally, for a Bus Operator, it is their job to spend a full working day (or evening) on the bus as opposed to a trip on the bus. Banning drinks for Bus Operators would be equivalent to an employer banning employees from drinking a coffee at their desk or counter.

Did you know...

Express Routes make local stops in a residential area and then operate as a limited stop service to the downtown core. Express services are only offered during peak periods, providing commuters with a quicker trip than a local transit service which stops at every stop. All Express bus stops are identified by a red bar and an EXPRESS decal. Check out the map to see if there is an Express route near you!

Lost and Found—Halifax Transit's Lost and Found is open Monday to Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and closed on holidays. There is no emergency service outside of these hours. Passengers are reminded to ensure they have all of their personal belongings with them when disembarking as HRT assumes no responsibility for passengers' personal belongings left behind. Passengers are encouraged to call (902) 490-6617 to inquire if the item has been turned in. Please note that Halifax Transit will dispose of perishable items immediately and may dispose of other lost and found items after 30 days by such manner as it determines appropriate.

Accessible Stops—Accessible low floor (ALF) buses load and unload passengers using mobility devices regardless of the route, so long as the accessible ramp can be lowered to load or unload the passenger. A list of the bus stops that are inaccessible, where the ramp cannot be deployed under any circumstance, can be found in the new Accessible Service Handbook and at <http://www.halifax.ca/transit/ALF.php>.



Smoking

In accordance with the Smoke-free Places Act and By-Law N-300 (Respecting Nuisances and Smoking), smoking and vaping on municipal property, including transit property and sidewalks, is permitted only within municipal designated smoking areas (DSAs). This includes both smoking and vaping tobacco and cannabis products.

Strollers

For the safety and well-being of babies and young children, other passengers, and Halifax Transit Operators, please respect the following guidelines:

- Strollers should be small, light-weight and foldable. Recommended size is 42" by 22.5" or smaller.
- Upon boarding the bus, children should be removed from the stroller and held by the parent or guardian. Those wishing to leave children in the stroller should remain near the front of the bus, utilizing the courtesy seats when available.
- The brake must be engaged after entering the bus and remain engaged until exiting the bus.
- The stroller should not obstruct the aisle or impede the flow of passengers.
