REPORT A POTHOLE / SINKHOLE

Call 311 to <u>report a pothole or sinkhole</u> on HRM owned streets or sidewalks.

Potholes are caused when the asphalt on the surface of the road has deteriorated from the top, but you can still see asphalt under the hole.

Sinkholes are caused by erosion from underneath, and when you look in it, you can't see any pavement.

FUNDING AWARDED TO BRIGHT IDEAS PROJECTS FOR CROSSWALK

SAFETY

HRM has awarded funding for bright ideas projects from community



members as part of the annual *Heads Up Halifax* campaign to help improve crosswalk safety across our region.

Eleven proposals were submitted and eligible to be considered by the evaluation panel. Awards have been granted for five successful proposals submitted by the following four organizations:

Ecology Action Centre:

- \$5,000 towards the Safety for All education effort for newcomers.
- Saint Mary's University Entrepreneurship Centre:
 - \$5,000 towards the coordination and facilitation of a crosswalk safety hackathon for students / youth and community members.
- Nova Scotia Community College:
 - \$5,000 towards the development of a cross block lighting prototype.
- Crosswalk Safety Society of Nova Scotia (2 projects):
 - \$5,000 towards the creation of fridge magnets
 - \$1,000 towards the development and distribution of a brochure

IMPORTANT NOTICE: HALIFAX TRANSIT SERVICE CHANGES EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 2019

On November 25, 2019, Halifax Transit will introduce large-scale service changes in Sackville, Bedford, Dartmouth, and Halifax Mainland South as part of the Moving Forward Together Plan. These service changes are outlined in Halifax Transit's 2019/20 Annual Service Plan, and were approved by Regional Council in April 2019.

This plan includes changes to the existing Rural Route 400 Beaver Bank. As of November 25, 2019, the existing Route 400 will be discontinued and will be partially replaced by the new Routes 86 Beaver Bank/186 Beaver Bank Express. However, the new routes will not provide service between Kinsac Road and Scotia Terrace as this portion of Beaver Bank Road experiences low ridership.

The new route will provide service on Beaver Bank Road between Kinsac Road and Sackville Terminal all day, seven days a week which means an increased level service compared to Route 400. The new service will also introduce express service on Beaver Bank Road. During the morning rush hour, Route 86 Beaver Bank will become Route 186 Beaver Bank Express and travel from Kinsac Road, to Sackville Terminal and then continue to the downtown Halifax arriving at Summer Street. In the afternoon rush hour, the express route will depart Summer Street and Downtown Halifax to Sackville Terminal and end at Kinsac Road.

In the Moving Forward Together Plan, this route was originally numbered Route 89/189 Beaver Bank. This has since changed to 86/186 for operational reasons.

More information on this service change and others will become available in the coming months. In the meantime, Halifax Transit's 2019/20 Annual Service Plan briefly details each change. Watch this page and Halifax Transit's Twitter for more information.
