

WELCOME NOVEMBER!





LUCASVILLE ROAD – HALIFAX WATER WATERMAIN TWINNING PROJECT UPDATE

Work on the Lucasville Road watermain twinning project is nearing completion. The new watermain has been installed and is now in the process of being tested and commissioned.



The majority of

base level asphalt has been laid. Three connections to, or crossings of, the existing main have been completed: this work necessitated the closures of Lucasville Road on weekends this past month. The good news is the Contractor worked hard to do this work over two weekends instead of the originally projected three.

Paving of the final layer of asphalt, in most sections of the work area, should be underway or completed. The section fronting Timber Trails will be paved last as there is still work to be completed on the existing main in this area.

Reinstatement of the edges of the road and remaining culvert work will continue over the next few weeks. It is anticipated that equipment will be offsite by mid-November. Some of the re-instatement work along the ditches, such as grass and other planting, may need to be carried over to spring 2020 for favorable planting conditions.

HALIFAX TRANSIT SERVICE CHANGES EFFECTIVE NOVEMBER 25th

On November 25, 2019, Halifax Transit will introduce large-scale service changes in Sackville, Bedford, Dartmouth, and Halifax Mainland South as part of the Moving Forward Together Plan. These service changes are outlined in Halifax Transit's 2019/2020 Annual Service Plan, which was approved by Regional Council in April 2019.
