
You may choose to attend one or more of the following events taking place in Halifax on November 11th:



We want to know what you think! Come on out to one of the informal sessions noted below for an opportunity to provide input and discuss the project with HRM staff.



NEW HALIFAX TRANSIT RURAL ROUTE# 415 PURCELLS COVE

CHANGE

The new Route 415 provides service between York Redoubt and Mumford Terminal via Purcells Cove Road during the weekday peak period. This new Rural Route ends at Mumford Terminal instead of continuing to the Bayers Road Shopping Centre as the existing Route 15 Purcells Cove does. Riders can transfer to Route 2 Fairview, Route 28 Bayers Lake or Route 29 Barrington to continue to the Bayers Road Shopping Centre.

WHY

This change is due to low ridership on existing Route 15 Purcells Cove to allow for the reallocation of resources elsewhere. This new Rural Route provides complementary service to the new Local Route 25.

WHY

Route 25 ends at Mumford Terminal to help create a transfer based system for a more reliable transit network. As a new route, Route 25 expands the reach of the transit network to service more residents of Williams Lake Road and the new community of Governor's Brook.

Do you want to learn more about how you can help your family and friends during an emergency?

In the critical hours following a crisis, while local and provincial response agencies are dealing with the immediate and urgent needs of the municipality, residents in affected communities need to be prepared to help themselves and to assist their neighbours.

Joint Emergency Management (JEM) is a concept developed by the Halifax Regional Municipality's Emergency Management Office (EMO), to allow community organizations to prepare for, and respond quickly to, a wide range of emergencies. JEM teams help the Halifax EMO by:

- Assisting residents prepare for disasters
- Locating comfort / evacuation centre sites
- Identifying Muster Points (local gathering spots) if a disaster is declared by the city
- Communications: helping people connect with and talk to EMO officials
- Identifying / locating people that may need extra help (seniors/disabled) during a disaster
- Teaching residents how to make a 72-hour emergency kit and why it is needed
