Development Agreement - Public Presentation

Why?

"Our mission is to utilize modern sustainability methods to provide a flow of ethically raised animal products and incorporate agritourism to promote small-scale farming."



What?

- Raise the amount of animals permitted on the farm.
- Build an on-site abattoir to process rabbits, chickens, and ducks.





Amount of animals permitted

- Actual:
 - 50 domestic fowls
 - 10 any other types of livestock
- Proposed:
 - 200 domestic fowls
 - 100 chickens
 - 100 ducks
 - 55 other type
 - 6 horse (board)
 - 8 hogs
 - 4 goats
 - 30 rabbits





Abattoir

- Size of the building: 24ft x 24ft, single story
- Monthly Production: 3 days
 - 30 meat chickens (May to October)
 - 20 ducks
 - 20 rabbits
- Designed with Dept of Env.
- Inspired by a facility in Bridgewater
- Engineered sceptic system
- Off-site disposal of by-product (city compost)




Where?

- 300 feet of ocean front






