TRAFFIC CALMING FOR SAFER STREETS

Traffic calming helps make neighbourhoods safer for non-drivers. That means slowing down cars, trucks, and motorcycles by altering driver behaviour. Studies have shown that reducing the posted speed limit in an area typically has no significant impact on how fast people drive.

Physical measures are more effective and could include speed humps, raised intersections and crosswalks, curb extensions, traffic circles or mini roundabouts, raised median islands or on-street parking.

If your street is owned and maintained by the municipality, it may be considered for traffic calming if it:

- is within a residential area
- is classified as a "local street" or "minor collector street"
- is not a multi-lane road
- has a posted speed limit not greater than 50 km/h
- is greater than 150m in length
- does not provide direct access to an emergency services building

You can initiate a review of traffic calming for your street by contacting 3-1-1. If speeding is a problem on your street and enforcement is needed, please call the Cole Harbour RCMP at 902-244-7208.

COLE HARBOUR HARVEST FESTIVAL

Due to arrival of Hurricane Dorian this year's Harvest Festival was rescheduled to September 21st as an outdoor movie night and fireworks. Thanks to the awesome volunteers and staff at Cole Harbour Place for all their hard work. Looking forward to a hurricane free festival in 2020!

FOREST HILLS PARKWAY ROAD CONSTRUCTION

In 2017, the municipality held public meetings at Cole Harbour Place to receive feedback from residents on improvements to the Forest Hills Parkway. The construction work taking place is a result of that consultation and will see the existing sidewalk become a greenway for active transportation, separated from vehicular traffic. The project will also result in improved connectivity with the adjacent Trans Canada Trail system. The work is being completed in two phases, Phase 1 from Main Street to Chameau Crescent (which has been completed) and Phase 2 from Chameau Crescent to Cole Harbour Road (2020-2021). An additional traffic light will be included in Phase 2 at Chameau/Flying Cloud.

Large design projects such as this are a result of a 'rethink' in designing complete streets with a focus on the pedestrians first as identified in the HRM Integrated Mobility Plan. More information on this plan may be found at https://www.shapeyourcityhalifax.ca/integratedmobility

EGG-LAYING HENS / CHICKENS

For those residents hoping to have back-yard chickens/ laying hens, you will be pleased to learn that on July 30th, Regional Council passed the following motion on Case 22227: That Halifax Regional Council direct the Chief Administrative Officer to initiate a process to consider amendments to the Regional Municipal Planning Strategy and all applicable Secondary Municipal Planning Strategies and Land Use By-laws as necessary to permit the keeping and raising of all egg-laying fowl consistent with the proposed policy direction outlined within the Discussion section of the staff report dated June 12, 2019.

Although the motion for a staff report passed, it is currently not permitted to own hens/chickens under the current Cole Harbour—Westphal Land Use Bylaw.

CALDWELL ROAD UPDATE

At a meeting of Regional Council last year, I tabled a petition I received with 80 signatures requesting sidewalk and curb upgrades to address pedestrian safety concerns on Caldwell Road.

This petition was sent to HRM Project Planning and Design and the response received from staff indicated that Caldwell Road, Cole Harbour Road to Hampton Green has a PCI of 91 (2016 rating) with good concrete curb, gutter and sidewalk on both sides of the road. Caldwell Road, Astral Drive to Atholea Drive, has a PCI (Pavement Condition Index) of 86 (2016 rating) with good concrete curb and gutter on both sides of the road. There is good concrete sidewalk on at least one side, and areas with both sides of the road. Caldwell Road, Hampton Green to Astral Drive has a PCI of 69 (2016 rating) with good, fair and poor asphalt curb and sidewalk.

Caldwell Road has been added to the 5-year capital plan.

PLAYGROUND AND COURT UPGRADES

I was pleased to see upgrades at the following playgrounds and courts this past construction season: Humber Park Elementary School, Carolyns Way Park, Astral Dive Neighbourhood Park (New Playground), BJ Higgins Upgrades—field/lights, Ross Road School Park and Sir Robert Borden Junior High School Park.

MASTER COMPOSTER RECYCLER PROGRAM



HRM's Master Composter Recycler (MCR) wrapped up its fall session in October. It is a free four-week education program that offered training sessions, handson workshops, and facility tours to allow participants to become more knowledgeable about how waste is managed in the Halifax region, from collection to processing. They also learned how to reduce waste through backyard composting and other at-home solutions. MCR is new to Nova Scotia but has been a popular and long-standing program in other municipalities in Canada and the United States.

Congratulations to graduates of this fall's program. Great work by staff on instilling environmental stewardship while providing a sense of family to a passionate group of learners.

SENIOR SNOW REMOVAL

The snow removal program is available to seniors (65 years of age or older) and persons with disabilities in the Halifax region who also meet the criteria below. The program applies to residential properties only—commercial properties are ineligible.

- Participants must reside in a single dwelling home which is owned or rented
- The total gross household income of all people living on the premises must not exceed \$32,000
- The program is NOT available to landlords

The program offers assistance to clear snow from steps and walkways, including front and back steps, walkways, ramps and access to fuel tanks. The program does not apply to the clearing of driveways. PARK PLAN FOR REHAB LANDS ON BISSETT ROAD



The municipality has begun a comprehensive park plan for the Rehab Lands on Bissett Road. Approximately 16 hectares of the lands associated with the Former Halifax County Rehabilitation Centre will be designated as parkland. One of the considerations for the new park, will be for an off-leash dog area. The Cole Harbour Open Spaces Plan approved by Regional Council in 2011, identified these lands as an important open space connection between Bissett Park and Cole Harbour Provincial Park. The recent opening of the Bissett Trail saw the first step in the park's development and the completion of an essential link in the municipality's active transportation network. Community engagement for the park planning will be happening this winter. More information will be available after the new year.
