Re: Sanitary Engineer's Recommendations

The following are recommendations of the Sanitary Engineer, which are concurred in by myself.

UNFIT FOR HABITATION 47 Cunard St.

Inspection of the above premises shows that they are in a condition which we feel is unfit for habitation. The adjoining building, 49 Cunard Street, was recently torn down and this also leaves the above premises in a very dangerous condition. It is recommended that the Committee classify 47 Cunard Street as unfit for habitation and that the said Committee order the premises to be vacated by not later than July 16th, 1949, and in case of disobedience of their order or re-occupation of the premises without a permit, a warrant be issued to the sheriff or a constable or a Sanitary Inspector to enforce compliance with the terms of this order.

BUILDING PERMIT Barrington St. at Africville.

An application has been received from Thomas Howe to erect a dwelling in Africville. This will necessitate a privy and well. It is recommended that the permit be granted providing Mr. Howe constructs
