Sir:-I beg to report on the value of the whole of the Tully property, so called, at Africville, in connection with Mr. McKean's request for a portion of it for shipbuilding purposes. Assuming the value of \$3000 placed on that portion originally proposed to be sold to Mr. McKean, to be a fair one, I think that a reasonable price for the whole property would be \$6500. As this property was originally required for the purpose of encouraging industries, I would suggest that should the Board decide to sell it to Mr. McKean, a clause be added to the deed that in the event of active work on any industry that may be established there, being discontinued for say twelve months, that the City be empowered to resume prosession of the same on payment of some stipulated price. H. W. Johnston, Acting City Engineer. His Worship the Mayor reports that Mr. McKean will not consider an idea of taking a lease of the property.
