Any apparture from the calendar would excate a problem inthat our statistics would all have to be adjusted to conform, with the Browniel pattern. Further, he had been, told, in discussing The matter with the official of the Department that the Minister was recrearing the topic of vacations with the idea of extending the school year to 200 days. Under the circumstances, the superirsor did not thenk it would be advisable to undertake any change in the school calendar at this time. Moved by Commr. Cowan, seconded by Commis. Smith that a letter be written the Minister of Education, adursing that if he is considering extending the School year, that consideration be given to the shortening of the holidays at Easter or Christmas, Kalter Han making any change in the valation, sluring the Summer Season.
