WELCOME MARCH!







SPRING WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

Commencing Monday, March 2nd at 12:01 a.m., annual spring weight restrictions will be in place for heavy vehicles travelling on municipally

maintained roads. This step is to minimize damage to municipal streets/roads. Regular weight tolerances apply on exempt roads.

SPRING WEIGHT RESTRICTIONS

The Halifax Regional Municipality has implemented regulations restricting the maximum vehicle and axle weights permitted on all Halifax maintained roads NOT referenced in Schedule "B". These restrictions will be in effect from: March 2, 2020
