




2. Architectural Importance



- 40 Tall Trees is a noteworthy, variant example of Shingle style architecture (1880-1920)
- Clearly conveyed by wood shingles that wrap the building, along with the enclosed veranda, complex roof, and muted detailing
- Also incorporates Queen Anne and Gothic Revival elements



3. Significance of Architect




William Critchlow Harris

- Designed by William Critchlow Harris
- Apprentice under architect David Stirling; became partners in 1877
- Dominion Architects for federal work in PEI
- Designed many churches, dwellings, and commercial buildings



4. Architectural Merit


- Concrete foundation with outward facing stones; an early example of wood platform framing
- Hybrid of the Shingle, Gothic Revival, Queen Anne styles
- Other character defining elements:
 - Overall asymmetry
 - Dynamic roof with hipped dormers and a conical-roof dormer
 - Polygonal corner tower
 - Buttresses
 - Partially enclosed veranda w/ Gothic-inspired arches
