Halifax, N.S., January 11/15.

The Board of School Commissioners, City.

Dear Sirs:

RE FINANCES.

I have already reported to you that I made application to Mr. MacIlreith for either financial assistance in repairing our schools or that the Reconstruction time went on I was fully satisfied that if we depended upon them to make the necessary repairs it would be a long while them to make the necessary repairs, it would be a long while before we would be able to occupy our buildings for school purposes, consequently Commissioner Parker, and myself waited upon the Board of Control and made known the facts of the case to them.

They agreed with us that it was necessary to begin work immediately on our schools and a resolution was prepared by the City Solicitor authorizing us to overdraw our account with our Bankers not exceeding \$15,000, which resolution was made for the purpose of guaranteeing that the Bank would be repaid. Mr. Hope, the Local Manager of the Bank recommended this to his Head Office, and they in turn said it
would be quite satisfactory provided that their legal advisers
in Halifax would recommend it from a legal standpoint. This
they refused to do contending that the City Charter did not
permit the School Poard or the Board of Control to overdraw for school purposes.

I then took the matter up with Mr. G.S.Campbell, chairman of the Finance Relief Committee and he promised to give the matter due consideration and recommend it to the Finance Committee. Since then I had an interview with Mr. Campbell in which he campbell in whi Finance Committee. Since then I had an interview with Mr. Campbell in which he suggested as there were some outstanding points between the School Board and the Reconstruction Committee it would be better to have these adjusted, after which he felt it would be better to have these adjusted, after which he felt that, if we made application for the necessary amount of financial aid, through the Executive Committee, they would in all probability assist us.

Having arranged our few differences with the Reconstruction Committee and I think to the entire satisfaction of all concerned, I would, therefore, recommend that we make application to the Executive Relief Committee for an amount covering the remains to the following buildings: covering the repairs to the following buildings:-
